HMAS PERTH

Lost at Sundra Strait 1942

Speaker: Male Student

Duration: 50secs.

- "I was one of 680 sailors aboard HMAS PERTH during war in the Pacific.
- "HMAS PERTH was sent to Java (now Indonesia) to withstand the seemingly invincible Japanese forces.
- "In 1942 ... It was at the 'Battle of the Sunda Strait' when 350 of the 680 Australian sailors died when our ship was attacked by the Japanese.
- "HMAS PERTH with American ship USS HOUSTON were both torpedoed by a Japanese ambush.
- "There was absolute chaos ... PERTH sunk ... taking more than half of its crew down with it ... as some of us scrambled into the water to get away.
- "An enemy ship picked us up ... we then endured a three year tortuous ordeal as Japanese 'Prisoners of War'.
- "We became slave labour ... forced to work on the Burma / Thai railway ... death was a constant ... but it was camaraderie of mateship that kept us going ... if you dropped ... you would be left behind to die".
