HMAS PERTH

Lost at Sunda Strait 1942

Speaker: Male Student

Duration: 50secs.

“I was one of 680 sailors aboard HMAS PERTH during war in the Pacific.

“HMAS PERTH was sent to Java (*now Indonesia*) to withstand the seemingly invincible Japanese forces.

“In 1942 ... It was at the ‘*Battle of the Sunda Strait*’ when 350 of the 680 Australian sailors died when our ship was attacked by the Japanese.

“HMAS PERTH with American ship USS HOUSTON were both torpedoed by a Japanese ambush.

“There was absolute chaos ... PERTH sunk ... taking more than half of its crew down with it ... as some of us scrambled into the water to get away.

“An enemy ship picked us up ... we then endured a three year tortuous ordeal as Japanese ‘*Prisoners of War*’.

"We became slave labour ... forced to work on the Burma / Thai railway ... death was a constant ... but it was camaraderie of mateship that kept us going ... if you dropped ... you would be left behind to die”.
