"Our team shared their expertise of delivering aged care differently with the Senator, and highlighted to her the importance of their work being seen for the true value it delivers.

"We also believe there needs to be a greater focus on reablement to empower older Australians to live a quality life. We are fortunate to have some fantastic recent success stories, and residents who were able to share their positive experience of aged care with the Senator."
